

KIDS, READ THIS FIRST

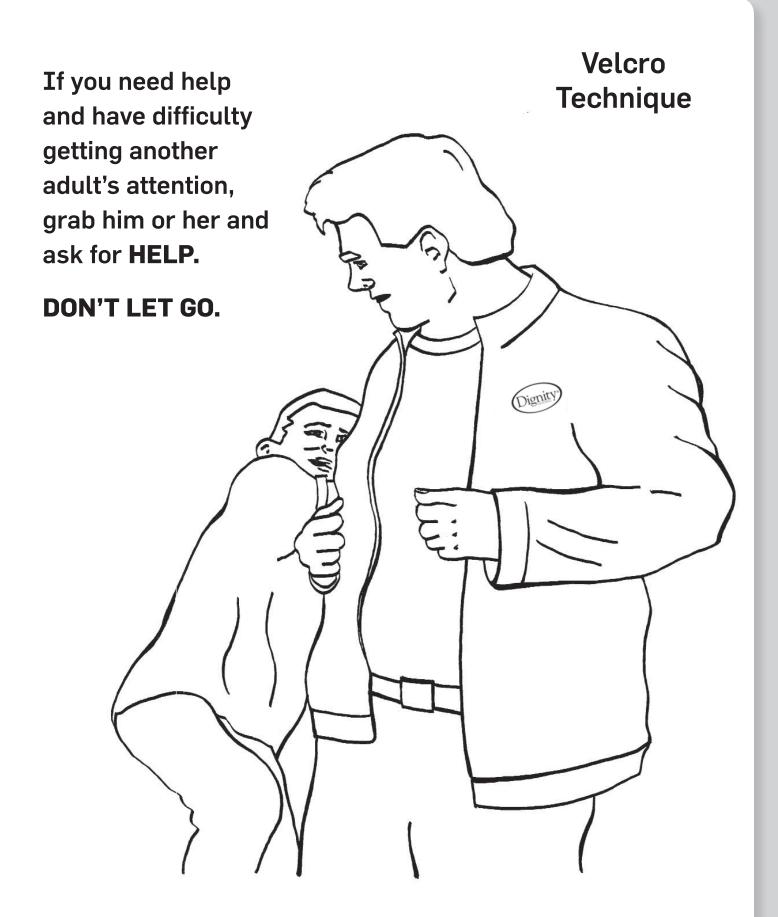

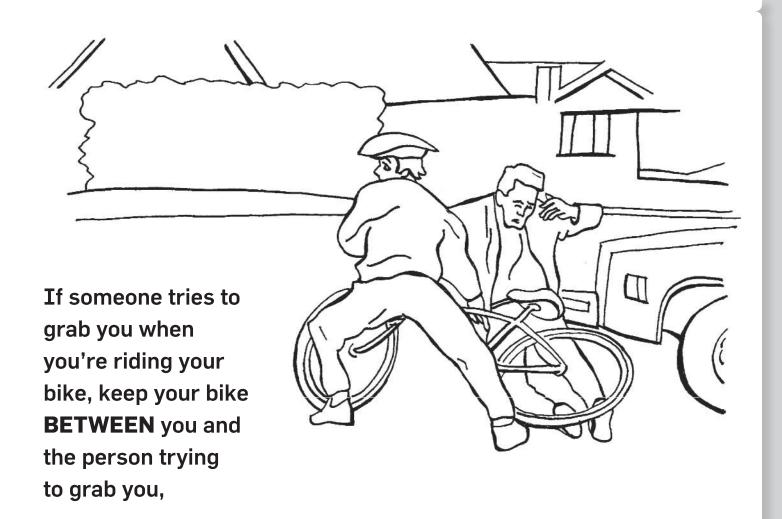
Dignity Memorial® Escape School® encourages you and your parents to talk about strangers, or people you don't know.

Dignity Memorial Escape School recommends that you define a person as good or bad by how he or she acts, not how he or she looks. In fact, a "stranger" may be the person that will help you in a potentially dangerous situation.

These techniques are only for use when you find yourself in a threatening situation. Talk to your parents if you have questions.

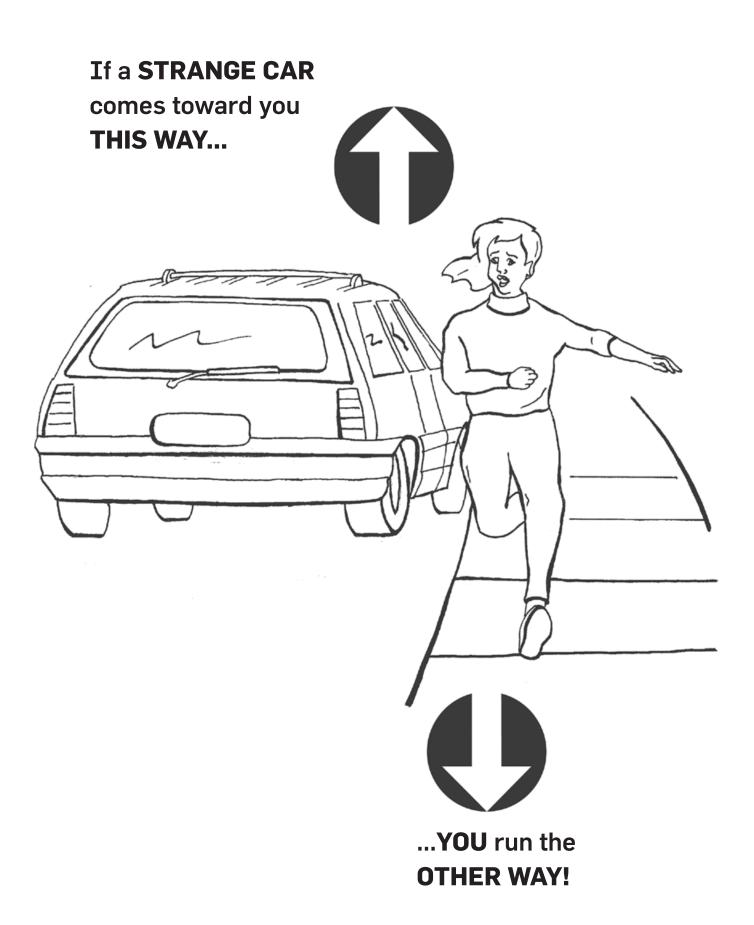




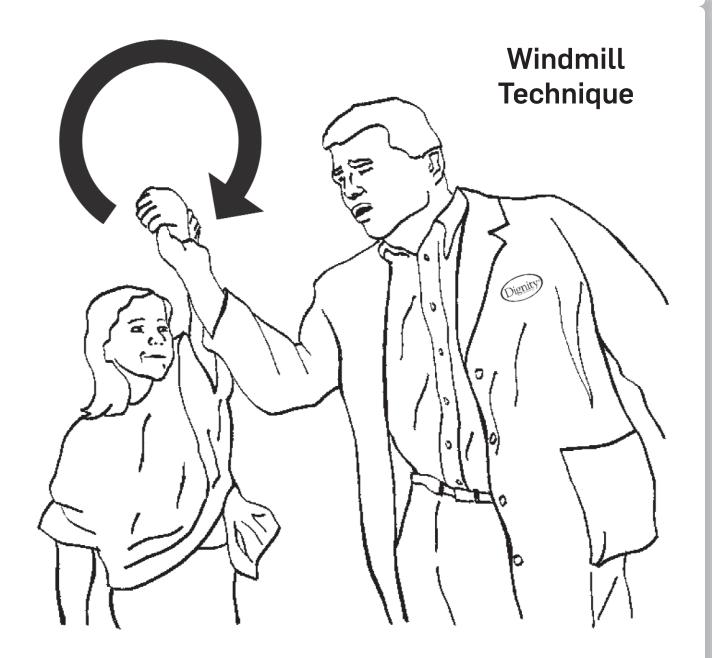

You can break a person's grip by **ROTATING** your arm in the direction his or her thumb is facing.

Make a **WINDMILL** with your arm to break a person's grip.



Sometimes a person may try to lure you away by appearing lost.



...it might be a trick.

GET HELP.



DON'T HELP!



Others may try to lure you away with stories of missing pets. If someone asks for your help to find a missing dog or cat, it might be a trick. **STAY AWAY**.



If you need help and can't find an adult, remember fire stations are a **SAFE** place to go.

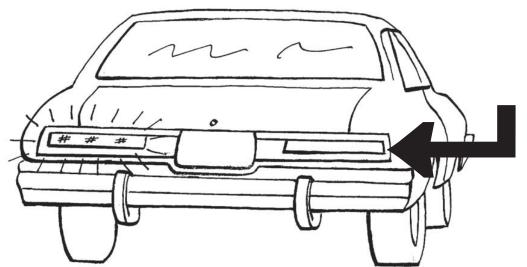


GET HELP.



If you're locked in the trunk of a car, try to find the wires to the taillights and pull hard.



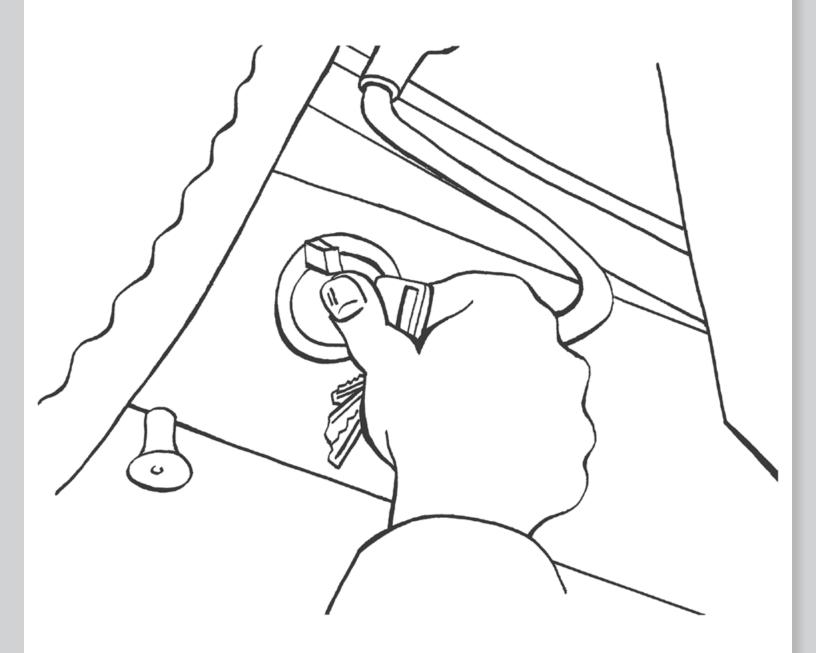


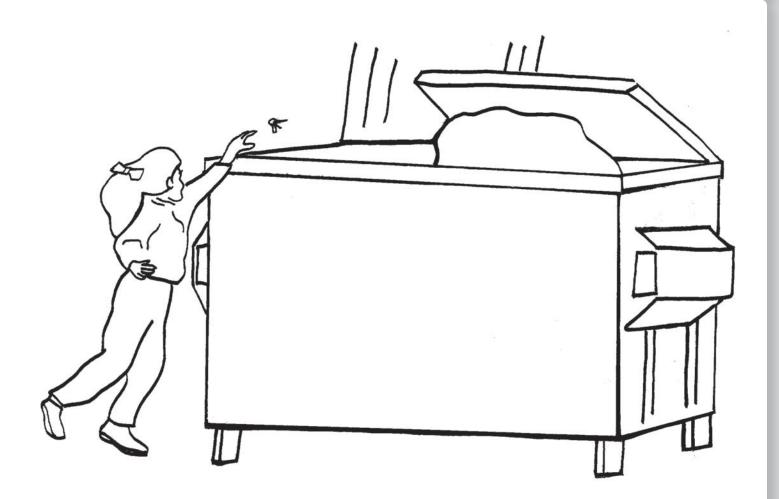
A taillight that won't work might make the police notice and stop the car. When the car stops, scream for help.

GO FOR THE KEYS.



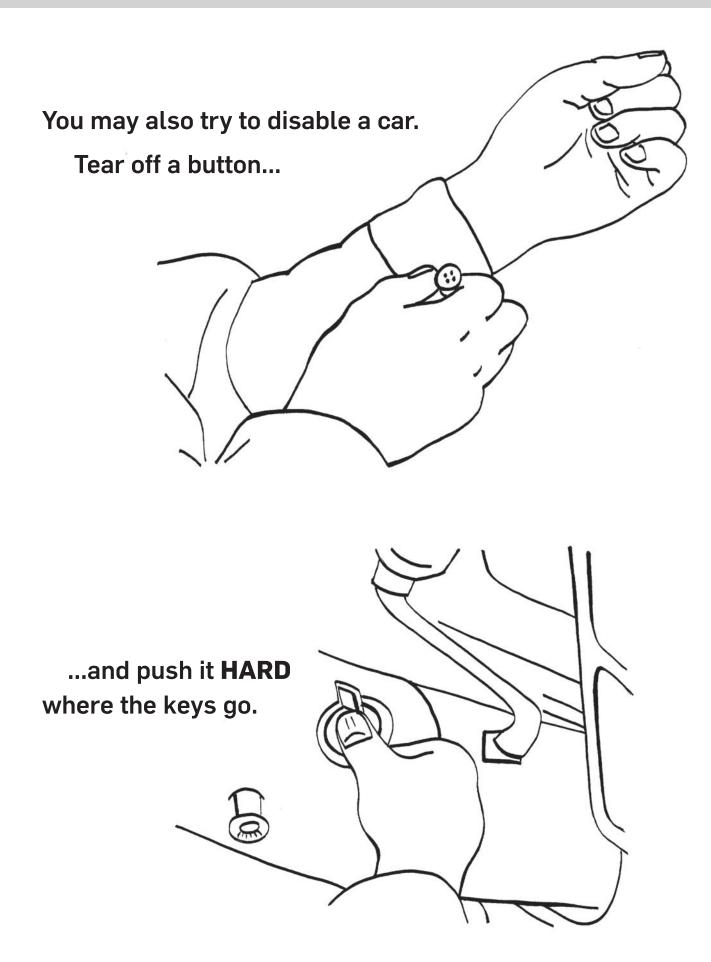


If you can get the keys...

THROW THEM AWAY.

Don't keep them with you as you run for safety.



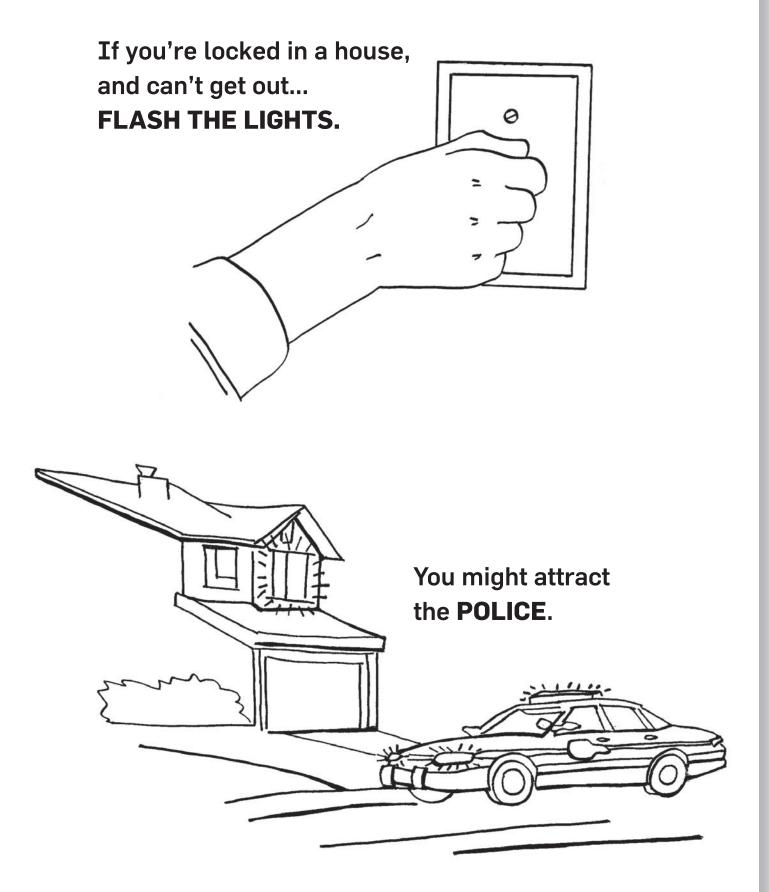


HONK THE HORN



AND SCREAM FOR HELP.





Ball up your socks, a towel, or something, put them in the toilet, and **FLUSH**.



A stopped up toilet might get someone else involved and give you a chance to **GET AWAY**.





Then **DROP THE PHONE.**Don't hang it up.

Remember, you don't need money to dial 911, even pay phones. Don't hang up the phone. The police will track the call to determine the address.



GO CRAZY.

Write down as many ways as you can think of to **GET ATTENTION** if someone is trying to harm you.

Remember, there are **NO RULES**. You can kick, scream or do **ANYTHING** if you are in danger. **GO CRAZY**.

10 HELPFUL HINTS FOR PARENTS

Get your child an I.D. bracelet. Engrave the back of it with a phone number and the word "REWARD."

Teach your child how to throw or drop the I.D. bracelet somewhere along the path of flight after abduction. This may help authorities track your child's direction.

Teach your child how to trip a fire alarm for help.

Teach your child how to board a bus and ask for help.

Take your child to a car lot and show him or her how it locks, windows and headlights work on as many different kinds of cars as possible.

Make sure he or she can read words like "open," "close," "on" and "off."

Show your child how to operate a trunk release handle found on newer automobiles.

Show your child how to quickly turn off a car and dispose of the keys.

Show your child every way you can think of to disable a car.

Show your child how to fog a window and write "HELP" backwards from the inside.
